
## My Medicare-How to Register using the Medicare Express App

## How to Register for "My Medicare" through your "Medicare Express Plus" App.


- You Must have already Linked your "MyGov" to your Medicare account
- You must have had at least 2 face to face appointments at Don Medical Clinic in the last 2 years to be eligible to register
- If you already have this App you are all ready to register. (You probably used this App to access your Medicare details OR your Covid 19 Vaccination certificate)
- Open the "Medicare Express Plus" App on your Smartphone (Android or IPhone)
- Login to the app. If you are a parent and going to register your children (under 14), register yourself first! Then register your children.
- If you are a DVA Patient- Use your Medicare card (not your DVA card) to register. If you don't have a Medicare card/Number, you will need to register in the practice with a manual form



















- Select "Don Medical Clinic"
- Then click "Next"





- You Need to select a "Preferred GP". This does not mean you will only see this GP. You may still see any of the GPs at the Practice. This is purely admin.
- If you are a parent and meet this criteria, register yourself, then afterwards, register your children (as they are linked to you, they will be eligible to register)
- You will then need to confirm your details, review the information and then "Submit"
- Once you complete registration, a notice will come to our practice at the end of each day and we then need to login from our end to accept new registrations,
- From November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 anyone registered with the practice will be then eligible for a higher Medicare rebate for longer telephone and video consultations.
- Some Pensioners, concession card holders and children under 16 MAY BE eligible for a higher rebate if bulk billed for some attendance items. (not all are eligible and this does not mean all consultations will be bulk billed)
